

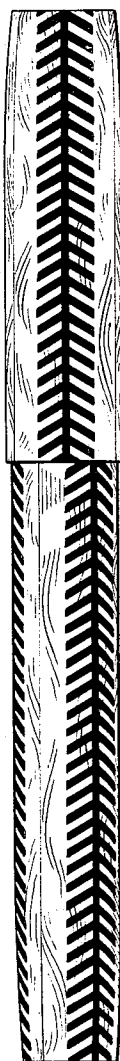

DESIGN FOR A FOUNTAIN PEN OR SIMILAR ARTICLE

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Paul M. Ressinger, a citizen of the United States and a resident of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Fountain Pen or Similar Article, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof, wherein—

The figure is a plan view of a fountain pen showing my new design.

The dominant feature of my design for a fountain pen resides in the type of ornamentation shown thereon and which consists of a series of ornamental bands extending axially of the pen, each band comprising a central stripe having ex-

tending angularly and laterally from opposite sides thereof, short barb-like bars of substantially the same width as the stripe, the bands being uniformly separated around the circumference of the pen by relatively plain, axially extending bands of substantially the same width as the ornamental bands.

It is to be understood that my design may be embodied in such articles as fountain pens and mechanical pencils without departing from the spirit of the invention.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a fountain pen or similar article, substantially as shown and described.
