DESIGN FOR A CLIP FOR A FOUNTAIN PEN OR THE LIKE

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Andreas Bienenstein, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Toledo, in the county of Lucas and State of Ohio, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Clip for a Fountain Pen or the Like of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawing forming a part thereof, in which

Figure 1 is a front elevation of a clip for a fountain pen or the like showing my new design; and Figure 2 is a side elevation of the same.

The dominant feature of my design consists principally in the streamline design which is ef-

fected by tapering the ends of the clip on sweeping graceful lines and by forming the lines of the neck portion on gradual curves causing a graceful merger between the head portion and body of the clip. Also the outer longitudinal profile of the clip is curved starting at a point substantially intermediate the length and extending to the upper end of the clip.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a clip for a fountain pen or the like substantially as shown and described.
