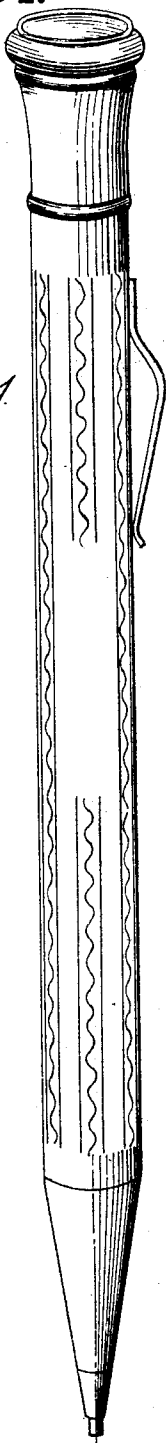
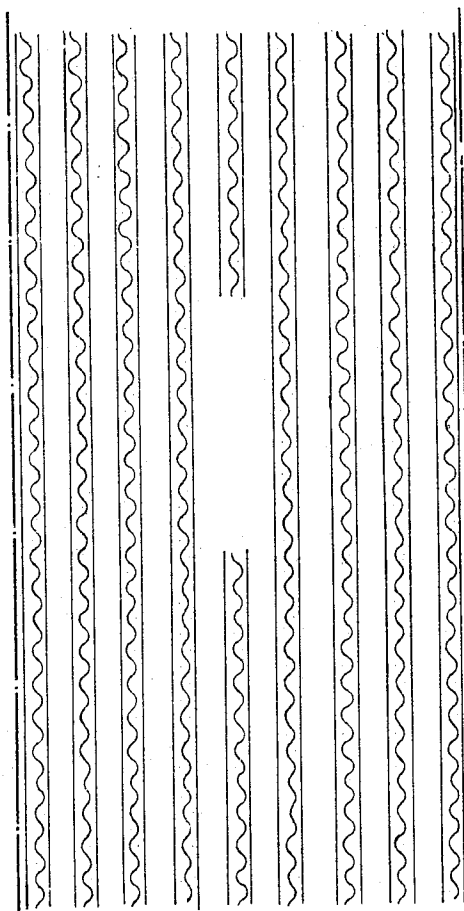

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN H. WORTHY, a citizen of the United States, residing at Elgin, in the county of Kane and State of Illinois, and whose post-office address is 707 Cedar avenue, in said city of Elgin, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Pen or Pencil Cases, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Referring to the figures:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the well-known Eversharp pencil ornamented with my new design on the circumference of the pencil case, and

Fig. 2 is a view of my new design, developed on a plane.

The particular design upon the pencil is set forth prominently by engine turning.
