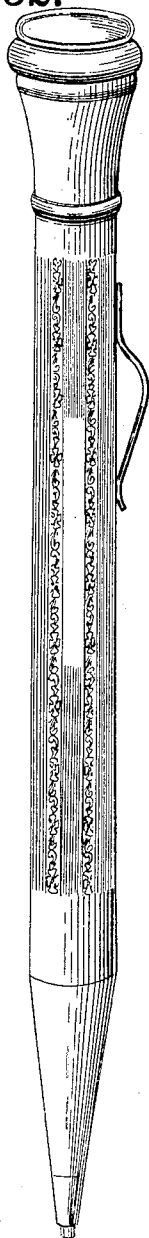
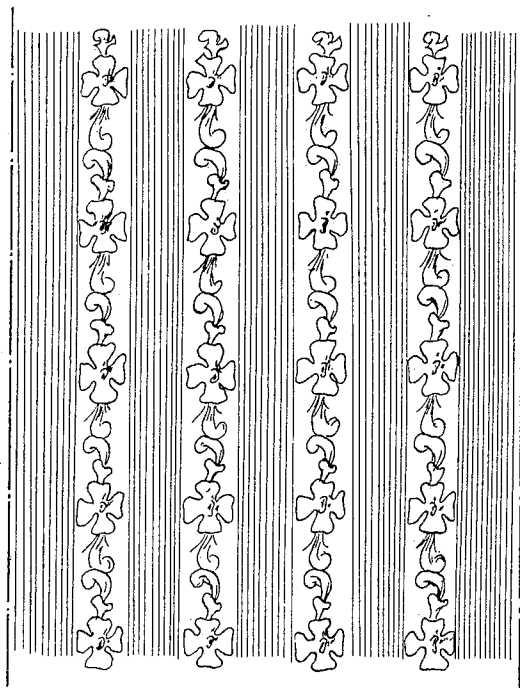

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JOHN H. WORTHY, a citizen of the United States, residing at Elgin, in the county of Kane and State of Illinois, and whose post-office address is 707 Cedar avenue, in said city, and CLARENCE W. LUND, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, and whose post-office address is 1814 South Lawndale avenue, in said city, have invented a new, original, and ornamental design for pen or pencil cases, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Referring to the figures:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the well-known Eversharp pencil ornamented with our new design on the circumference of the pencil case, and

Fig. 2 is a view of our new design, developed on a plane.

The longitudinally extending spaced groups of lines are placed thereon by engine turning. Within the wider spaces between said groups, longitudinally extending flower or foliage designs are engraved.

We claim:
