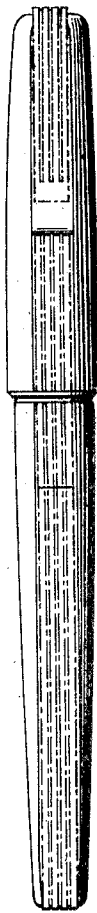


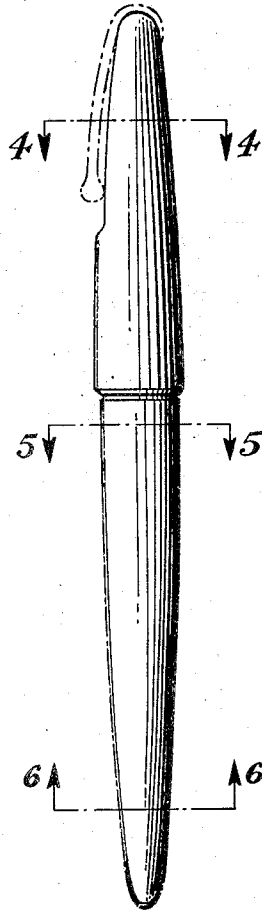

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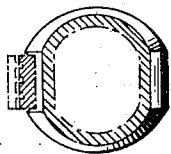

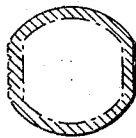

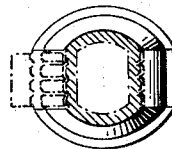

## DESIGN FOR A FOUNTAIN PEN

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, Warren Green and Peter Schladermundt, both citizens of the United States, residing in Noroton Heights, county of Fairfield, and State of Connecticut, and Bronxville, county of Westchester, and State of New York, respectively, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Fountain Pen, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof, wherein:

Fig. 1 is a front elevational view of a fountain pen showing our design;

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view of the pen;

Fig. 3 is a rear elevational view of the pen; and

Figs. 4, 5 and 6 are cross-sectional views in the direction of the arrows on the lines 4—4, 5—5 and 6—6 respectively, of Fig. 2.

The essential features of our design reside in the parts shown in full lines and in particular in the transversely flat portions extending throughout the length of the pen and in the taper extending from the central portion towards both ends, the taper at the bottom end being more pronounced than the taper at the top end.

We claim:

The ornamental design for a fountain pen, substantially as shown and described.
