COMPLETE SPECIFICATION.

Improvements in Caps and Clips for Fountain Pens.

We, Asahi Watanabe, a subject of the Emperor of Japan, of 2607, Miyanaka, Nishisugamo-Machi, Kitatoshima-Gori, Tokyo-l'u, Empire of Japan, and 5 Kabushiki Kaisha Namiki Seisakujo, of 3, 3-Chome, Minami - Denma - Cho, Kyobashi-Ku, Tokyo-Shi, Japan, a Corporation duly organised and existing under the laws of Japan, do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:—

This invention relates to caps with a 15 clip for fountain pens and has for its object to provide a cap with a clip attached thereto by means not visible on the out-

In order that the invention may be the 20 better understood drawings are appended in which:—

Fig. 1 is a front view of a cap embodying our invention partly in section.

Fig. 2 is a perspective view of a clip.

Referring to the accompanying drawings, I indicates a cap for fountain pens, which cap is of substantial thickness at the closed end and is provided with a threaded hole 2 for receiving a screw 3 applied from the inside. 4 indicates a clip having at one end a bulbous enlargement, said clip being bent at the other end at a right angle to the body, the length of the bent portion being substantially equal to the distance from the outside wall of the cap to the opposite inner

wall thereof. The bent portion is provided with a perforation o for the passage of the screw 3, the width of the bent portion being smaller than the inner diameter of the bore of the cap.

The clip is secured in position by passing the bent portion of the clip 4 having the perforation 5, through a small slot 6 of such dimensions as to closely fit the said bent portion, said slot being formed directly below the surface of the thickened end for that purpose, and is secured to the cap by means of the screw 3, a washer 7, if desired, being interposed between 50 the head of the screw and the clip.


In this way, the clip is easily and firmly attached to the cap without affecting its appearance.


Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of our said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, we declare that what we claim is:—

A cap having a clip for a fountain pen, in which the clip has a bent portion adapted to be secured to the inner bottom surface of the bore of the cap by extending inwardly through a slot formed in said cap, and is attached to the cap by means of a screw passing through a perforation in the bent portion and with or without a washer interposed between the head of the screw and said clip.
